Summary:

Since the first observation of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) in Oregon in 2022, City officials have been working with the Oregon Department of Forestry on a plan for responding to the arrival of this aggressive tree pest to slow its spread and reduce impacts to Salem's tree canopy, especially in disadvantaged communities. With the detection of EAB in Marion County in July 2024, it is imperative that the City take action to protect important ash trees through treatment, begin underplanting of other species in areas with ash, and conduct public outreach and awareness. The City has the opportunity to apply for up to \$750,000 over a period of three to four years to conduct work related to EAB and ash trees. The grant does not require matching funds; however, staff time will be needed to administer the grant.

Chapter 70 (Utilities) and Chapter 71 (Stormwater).

Summary:

In 2021, the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) issued to the City of Salem a permit authorizing discharges of stormwater from the City's municipal stormwater system into waters of the state. This permit, issued under the authority of the federal Clean Water Act, follows an earlier permit issued to the City in 2010. The new permit contains updated requirements related to

stormwater discharges from new development and redevelopment projects. To comply with the requirements of the new permit, the City must amend Salem Revised Code (SRC) Chapter 70 (Utilities) and SRC Chapter 71 (Stormwater) with an effective date of November 1, 2024. City Council conducted First Reading of Ordinance Bill No. 9-24 on July 8, 2024. A public hearing was conducted on August 26, 2024.

Proposal to vacate a portion of right-of-way for 1st Street NW.

Recommendation:

Conduct second reading of Ordinance Bill No. 10-24 (Attachments 1 and 2), which vacates a portion of the right-of-way for 1st Street NW.

Summary:

The proposed action would vacate a portion of the right-of-way (approximately the northern 13 feet) for 1st Street NW, east of Murlark Street NW. The remaining right-of-way would be improved to an alternate street standard as an alley through development of adjoining properties. The area proposed for vacation is revised from what was previously considered in February 2023. Vacating this portion of right-of-way and improving the remaining right-of-way to an alternate street standard as an alley will help support development in the surrounding area.

MEETING PROCEDURES

City Council meets on the second and fourth Mondays of each month at 6:00 p.m. All meetings are in the Council Chambers, Room 240, 555 Liberty St. SE.

The Mayor, who is the presiding officer, is elected at large for a term of two years. Councilors are elected for four year terms for each of the City's eight Wards. These nine officers comprise the Council who make the policy decisions for municipal activity and pass its ordinances and regulations.

Because the Mayor and Councilors' positions are part time, without pay, the Council appoints a City Manager who is responsible for the administration and execution of the City's policies and ordinances.

The City Council generally follows Robert's Rules of Order, but has adopted supplementary rules that may be found on the City's website at: http://www.cityofsalem.net/Pages/council rules.aspx.

THE CONSENT CALENDAR

The Consent Calendar allows the Council to save time by acting on everything listed on that part of the agenda with one motion instead of considering each item separately. If a City Councilor believes a matter on the Consent Calendar deserves further discussion, the Councilor can request that item be removed from the Consent Calendar and considered separately under "Special Orders of Business."

PUBLIC COMMENT

There are two times at every regular City Council meeting when the public has an opportunity to address the City Council. The first time is immediately prior to the Consent Calendar. This time is reserved for questions or statements regarding items appearing on the agenda, except public hearings and the merits of land use issues. The second time is at the end of the agenda. At this time, you can address the City Council on any matter of public concern, other than an agenda item. The Mayor will announce the time for public comment, and invite persons to address the City Council. Each person has three minutes to address the City Council. The time light on the podium will flash yellow when you have one minute left, and will turn red when your time has expired.

HOW TO GET YOUR COMMENTS INCLUDED AS PART OF THE AGENDA

Any written comments that you wish to be given to the City Council that are about an item on an agenda must be submitted to the City Recorder by 3:30 p.m. on the day of the City Council meeting when the item will be considered. If you have some matter that you wish to have the City Council consider in the future, you are encouraged to submit your suggestion in writing to the City Manager at 555 Liberty Street SE, Room 220, Salem, OR, or by e mail to: manager@cityofsalem.net.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The City Council can hold public hearings to consider legislative, quasi judicial or administrative matters. To testify at a hearing, you may sign up on the Hearing Roster located near the east entrance to the Council Chambers before the Mayor convenes the meeting. At the time for the hearing on the agenda, the Mayor will announce when the public hearing is open. If you have signed up to speak, come forward to the podium when the Mayor calls your name. State your name and either your address or the ward you live in. If you wish to receive notice of any written decision reached at the hearing, you must provide the City Recorder your address. When you have finished speaking, the Mayor will ask the Council if there are any questions for you, so please remain at the podium for a moment.

The time limit is 3 minutes per person for legislative and administrative hearings. The time limits for quasi judicial hearings in non land use cases are as follows:

- 1. Staff Presentation 15 minutes
- 2. Affected Party 15 minutes
- 3. Neighborhood Associations 5 minutes
- 4. Other Interested Persons 3 minutes per person
- 5. Rebuttal by Affected Party 7 minutes

Time limits for quasi judicial land use hearings are governed by Rule 19 of the Council Rules. Parties to land use cases are encouraged to review that rule as time limits vary depending on the nature of the hearing.
