I feel that my experience and knowledge would be helpful to the committee, and I am interested in finding another way I can contribute to the City of Salem and our community.

My education consists of a Bachelor's degree in Economics, a Master's degree in Agricultural Economics, and Ph.D. level studies in Agricultural and Resource Economics. This education gave me experience in data analysis, fiscal policy, and monetary policy, all of which are helpful for understanding and making recommendations for the city's budget. My professional experience includes being the Deputy Director for the Workforce and Economic Research Division of the Oregon Employment Department, which has 53 staff and a budget of about \$13 million.
