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The City of Salem ordains as follows:

Section 2. SRC 900.015, 900.025, 900.030, 900.035, 900.040, 900.090, 900.160, 900.165, 900.170, 900.200, 900.205, 900.210, 900.215, 900.220, 900.235, 900.240, 900.245, and 900.250 are amend as follows:

- (a)** Official traffic control devices.
- (b)** Signs required to be erected by public officers pursuant to law or by order of the court.
- (c)** Temporary signs located in Wallace Marine Park's Sports Field Complex allowed and regulated pursuant to a park use permit issued by the City.
- (d)** Public murals and Public Art, as defined by SRC 15.010, and regulated under the provisions of SRC Chapter 15, and any rules adopted thereunder.
- (e)** Graffiti resistant coverings, containing only graphics or images, installed on equipment enclosures owned by the public or a public utility, or other temporary structures serving the public.

(a) Applicability. Except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, a permit is required for the construction, erection, enlargement, alteration, or relocation of any sign.

(b) Procedure Type. An application for a sign permit is a Type I procedure under SRC Chapter 300.

(c) Additional Submittal Requirements. In addition to the submittal requirements under

SRC Chapter 300, an application for a sign permit shall contain:

- (1) The location of the sign by street and number.
- (2) The name and address of the sign owner and of the sign erector.
- (3) ~~Two complete sets of plans~~ Plans for the sign, in a graphic form, detailed and clear enough to show compliance with this Chapter. At a minimum, the plans shall include:
 - (A) A detailed drawing of the sign, drawn to scale.
 - (B) Site plan drawn to scale, including location of all existing signs on the property and their sizes.
 - (C) Elevations of the building or structure with signs.
 - (D) Identification of materials and type of sign.
 - (E) A statement whether the sign is located on property owned or leased by the person constructing, erecting, or using the sign.
- (d) **Criteria.** An application for a sign permit shall be granted if the following criteria are met:
 - (1) The sign meets the requirements of SRC Chapter 56.
 - (2) The sign is allowed in the zone.
 - (3) The sign will not interfere with the use of any public right-of-way, other public easements, or other publicly owned property.
 - (4) The sign conforms to all the applicable standards in this Chapter.
- (e) **Expiration.** Sign permits shall be valid for one hundred eighty days after the date of issuance. The Director may grant a one-time extension for a sign permit, not to exceed ninety days, upon showing that there was reasonable cause for the delay and that the construction, erection, alteration, or other work still complies with this Chapter.
- (f) **Permit Fees.** The application for a sign permit shall be accompanied by a fee as prescribed by resolution of the council.

900.030. Exceptions from Permit Requirement.

- (a) The following activities do not require a sign permit:
 - (1) Changing of copy on a sign specifically designed for the use of replaceable copy.
 - (2) Painting, repainting, cleaning, and normal maintenance and repair of a sign, where no

- 1 substantial structural alteration is made.
- 2 **(b)** The following signs do not require a sign permit, but are otherwise regulated by this
- 3 Chapter:
- 4 **(1)** Temporary signs ~~not located in the public right-of-way.~~
- 5 **(2)** Signs for dwelling units authorized under SRC 900.185(a).
- 6 **(3)** Vehicle directional signs.
- 7 **(c)** The following signs do not require a sign permit, and are allowed in addition to any other
- 8 signs otherwise allowed by this Chapter:
- 9 **(1)** A warning sign that does not exceed four square feet in display surface and six feet in
- 10 height, that is not located in a vision clearance area, and that is erected on private
- 11 property to warn the public of a danger on, or prohibiting or limiting access to, the
- 12 premises on which the sign is located.
- 13 **(2)** Permanent building plaques, cornerstones, name plates, and similar building
- 14 identifications.
- 15 **(3)** House and building numbers where the numerals do not exceed six inches in height.
- 16 **(4)** Historical markers erected or maintained by public authority or by a historical society
- 17 or historical organization identifying sites, buildings, or structures of recognized
- 18 historical value.
- 19 **(5)** Non-illuminated signs not visible from a public sidewalk, street, highway, or alley.
- 20 **(6)** Interior signs.
- 21 **(A)** Non-illuminated interior signs in commercial and industrial zones including, but
- 22 not limited to, signs attached to or painted on the inside of a window.
- (B)** Illuminated interior signs intended to be viewed from the public sidewalk, street,
- highway, alley, plaza, park, or other similar public place; provided, however, that the
- sign does not flash or employ an effect, and does not exceed eight square feet in
- display surface.
- (C)** Illuminated interior signs not intended to be viewed from the public right-of-
- way.
- (7)** Directional signs that do not exceed eight square feet of display surface.

1 (8) Directional signs in commercial and industrial zones that do not exceed twenty-two
2 square feet of display surface that designate an automobile service entrance onto the
premises, and limited to one per business per premise.

3 (9) Temporary signs authorized by a park use permit.

4 (10) Art markers erected, maintained or authorized by the City identifying Public Art or
5 Public Mural.

6 **900.035. Sign Adjustments.**

7 (a) **Applicability.** ~~The Director may grant adjustments of up to ten percent of the applicable~~
height and display surface size standards in this Chapter.

8 (1) Classes.

9 (A) A Class 1 adjustment is an adjustment of up to ten percent of the applicable
height and display surface size standards in this Chapter.

10 (B) A Class 2 adjustment is an adjustment to any standard in this chapter other than a
Class 1 adjustment.

11 (2) Limitations. Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, an adjustment shall
12 not be granted to:

13 (A) allow a sign prohibited by SRC 900.020, "Prohibited Signs."

14 (B) decrease a setback or a special setback.

15 (C) allow placement of a sign in a vision clearance area.

16 (D) allow structural alterations to a non-conforming or non-complying sign.

17 (E) allow any sign other than those specifically allowed by this Chapter.

18 (F) modify the display or brightness regulations for electronic display signs
established by SRC 900.090.

19 (b) **Procedure Type.** ~~A sign adjustment is~~ Class 1 is and Class 2 adjustments are processed
as a Type II Procedure under SRC Chapter 300.

20 (c) **Additional Submittal Requirements.** In addition to the submittal requirements for a
sign permit required by SRC 900.025, an application for a sign permit that includes an
adjustment shall contain a statement of the specific standard for which the adjustment is
requested, and the amount of the adjustment.

1 **(d) Criteria.** ~~An application for a sign adjustment shall be granted if the adjustment sought~~
2 ~~is not more than ten percent of the applicable height and display surface size standards~~
3 ~~applicable to the sign in this Chapter.~~

4 (1) An application for a Class 1 adjustment shall be granted if the adjustment is not more
5 than ten percent of the applicable height and display surface size standards applicable to
6 the sign in this chapter.

7 (2) An application for a Class 2 adjustment shall be granted if all of the following criteria
8 are met:

9 (A) The purpose underlying the specific standard proposed for adjustment is:

10 (i) Clearly inapplicable to the property; or

11 (ii) Equally or better met by the proposed sign.

12 (B) If located within a residential zone, the proposed sign will not detract from the
13 livability or appearance of the residential area.

14 (C) If more than one adjustment has been requested, the cumulative effect of all the
15 adjustments result in a project which is still consistent with the overall purpose of the
16 zone.

17 **(e) Concurrent Processing Required.** Applications for sign adjustments shall be processed
18 concurrently with the sign permit application.

19 **900.040. Sign Variances.**

20 **(a) Applicability.** Sign variances may be granted to the height and display surface
21 standards, to increase the number of allowed signs, to allow relocation of a sign, and to allow
22 structural alterations to a sign.

(1) Limitation. A sign variance shall not provide for any of the following:

(A) To allow a sign prohibited by SRC 900.020, "Prohibited Signs."

(B) To decrease a setback or a special setback.

(C) To allow placement of a sign in a vision clearance area.

(D) To allow structural alterations to a non-conforming or non-complying sign.

~~**(E)** To authorize a sign not otherwise permitted on the property for which the~~
variance is sought.

1 ~~(F)~~ **(E)** To allow any sign other than those specifically allowed by this Chapter.

2 ~~(G)~~ **(F)** To modify the display ~~and~~or brightness regulations for electronic display
3 signs established by SRC 900.090.

4 **(b) Procedure Type.** A sign variance is a Type III procedure under SRC Chapter 300.

5 **(c) Submittal Requirements.** In addition to the submittal requirements for a sign permit
6 required by SRC 900.025, an application for a sign permit that includes a variance shall
7 contain a statement of the specific standard for which the variance is requested, and the
8 amount or scope of the variance.

9 **(d) Criteria.** An application for a sign variance shall be granted if the following criteria are
10 met:

11 **(1)** Compliance with the applicable standard would create an unnecessary hardship due
12 to unique or unusual physical conditions of the property over which the applicant has no
13 control, such as topography and lot shape, which are not present on other properties in the
14 vicinity that have the same zone designation; the hardship does not result from actions of
15 the applicant, owner, or previous owners of the property; and the sign variance is limited
16 to the minimum reasonably necessary to alleviate the problem created by the unique or
17 unusual physical conditions;

18 **(2)** The sign variance is necessary to permit signage comparable with other properties in
19 the vicinity that have the same zone designation;

20 **(3)** The sign variance will not adversely affect the function or appearance of the
21 development and use of the property and surrounding properties; and

22 **(4)** The sign variance will not impose limitations on other properties and signage in the
area, including signage that would be allowed on adjacent properties.

(e) Conditions of Approval. The review authority may impose conditions on the approval
of a sign variance necessary to establish compliance with the approval criteria.

(f) Concurrent Processing Required. Applications for a sign variance shall be processed
concurrently with the sign permit application.

900.090. Electronic Display Signs.

(a) No electronic display sign may be erected in a residential zone without first obtaining an

1 electronic display sign conditional use permit pursuant to SRC 900.045.

2 **(b)** No electronic display sign shall be allowed within a historic district.

3 **(c)** All electronic display signs shall meet the following standards:

4 **(1) Zones.**

5 **(A)** In all industrial zones, public zones, South Waterfront Mixed-
6 Use (SWMU) zones, and commercial zones, other than the Commercial Office (CO),
7 and Neighborhood Commercial (CN) zones, the change from one electronic display
8 to another electronic display shall be no more frequent than once every eight seconds,
9 except changes to correct hour-and-minute or temperature information, which may
10 change no more often than once every three seconds.

11 **(B)** In all residential zones, Commercial Office (CO) zone, Neighborhood
12 Commercial (CN) zone, Neighborhood Center Mixed-Use (NCMU) zone, and
13 Fairview Mixed-Use (FMU) zone, the change from one electronic display to another
14 electronic display shall be no more frequent than once every hour, except changes to
15 correct hour-and-minute or temperature information, which may change no more
16 often than once every three seconds.

17 **(2) Change of Display.** The actual change of display for an electronic display sign shall
18 be completed in two seconds or less. Displays may change by fade or by instantaneous
19 change from one static display to another, but shall remain as a static display after
20 completing the change, and, once changed, shall remain static until the next change.
21 Unless specifically authorized by this Chapter, dissolve, scrolling, travel, and video
22 display are prohibited.

(3) Brightness. All electronic display signs must be constructed, be operated, or
otherwise function in such a way as to ~~not exceed~~ meet the provisions of this paragraph.

(A) ~~At the time of installation, electronic display signs may be illuminated to a~~
~~degree of brightness that is no greater than 7,500 nits between sunrise and sunset and~~
~~that is no greater than 1,000 nits between sunset and sunrise; provided, however, that~~
~~an electronic display sign comprised solely of one color shall not exceed the~~
~~following levels: shall~~ not exceed 0.3 foot-candles above ambient light as measured

1 using a foot-candle (Lux) meter at a pre-set distance in accordance with the
2 following method:

- 3 ~~(i) For a display comprised of red only, 3,150 nits between sunrise and sunset,~~
4 ~~and 450 between sunset and sunrise;~~
5 ~~(ii) For a display comprised of green only, 6,300 nits between sunrise and sunset,~~
6 ~~and 900 nits between sunset and sunrise;~~
7 ~~(iii) For a display comprised of amber only, 4,690 nits between sunrise and~~
8 ~~sunset, and 670 nits between sunset and sunrise.~~
9 (i) At least 30 minutes past sunset, record the ambient light while the sign is off
10 or displaying all black copy, or with the sign's illumination blocked.
11 (ii) The meter shall be held at a height of five feet above grade at the distance as
12 set in table 900-1..
13 (iii) The meter shall be aimed toward the center of the automatic changeable
14 copy sign face.
15 (iii) From the same location, a second reading shall be recorded while the sign
16 display is on and not blocked.

21 ~~(B) All electronic display signs must be maintained and operated to meet the~~

1 following brightness standards:

2 ~~(i) No sign shall be brighter than is necessary for clear and adequate~~

4 ~~(ii) No sign shall be of such intensity or brilliance as to impair the vision of a~~
5 ~~motor vehicle driver with average eyesight or to otherwise interfere with the~~
6 ~~driver's operation of a motor vehicle.~~

7 ~~(iii) No sign shall be of such intensity or brilliance that it interferes with the~~

19 notified by the Director that it is not complying with the standards in this section.

20 **(d)** Notwithstanding any other provision in this Chapter, a municipal corporation providing
21 transit services within the corporate limits of the city may erect one electronic display sign in
22 each of the corporation's transit stops, which shall be limited to two square feet in display
surface, screened from adjacent residential properties, and used only for the transmission of
public information by the corporation.

900.160. Temporary Signs, General Standards.

19 **(a)** Temporary signs shall not be attached to fences, trees, shrubbery, utility poles, or like
20 items and shall not obstruct or obscure permanent signs on adjacent premises.

21 **(b)** No temporary sign shall be placed within a sidewalk intersection.

22 **(c)** Except as provided in SRC 900.100, no temporary sign shall be installed in or project

1 over public right-of-way.

2 **(d)** No temporary sign shall be erected or maintained which, by reason of its size, location,
3 or construction constitutes a hazard to the public.

4 **(e)** Lawn signs and sidewalk signs shall not exceed a height of thirty inches above grade.
5 Portable signs shall not exceed a height of six feet above grade.

6 **(f)** Lawn signs and sidewalk signs may be displayed a maximum of two, sixty-day
7 continuous periods per year. Portable signs may be displayed a maximum of one year.

8 **(g)** Businesses with canopies, including but not limited to, gasoline stations, may have one
9 or more temporary signs, with a total collective display surface not to exceed twenty-four
10 square feet per canopy. The signs may be freestanding or attached to the supporting structure
11 of the canopy, provided they are not installed in a manner that would present a hazard to
12 vehicles driving under the canopy.

13 **(h) Portable Signs.**

14 **(1)** Portable signs shall be placed and maintained such that a pedestrian pathway not less
15 than five feet wide, and a vehicle buffer zone of not less than three feet wide, at all times
16 provides free and unobstructed passage on the sidewalk. The pathway shall begin either
17 where the sidewalk and the property line meet or between the portable sign and the street
18 when the sidewalk sign is placed next to the building or property line and then extends
19 into, or is placed entirely on, the adjacent sidewalk.

20 **(2)** Portable signs shall be placed and maintained such that a vehicle buffer zone not less
21 than three feet wide at all times provides for free and unobstructed passage on the
22 sidewalk.

(3) The portable sign shall not limit or interfere with the free and unobstructed use of the
sidewalk.

(4) The placement of portable signs shall be limited to the normal business hours that the
premises is open for business, and shall be removed from the sidewalk when the premises
is not open for business.

(5) Placement shall be within the sidewalk area directly in front of the business premises;
provided, however, that a portable sign may be placed on the sidewalk in front of an

1 adjacent business if the business owner first secures written approval from the adjacent
2 business. Notwithstanding this subsection, no more than one portable sign shall be
permitted in the sidewalk area in front of a single business premises.

3 **(6)** No portable sign shall be located in an alley, or shall be located on or attached to
4 streetscape landscaping or furniture.

5 **(7)** Portable sign shall be no more than thirty inches in height and twenty-four inches in
6 width.

7 **(i) Temporary Sign Displays.** Where allowed in the zone, temporary sign displays
shall comply with the following:

8 **(1)** Temporary sign displays shall not use propellers or similar rotating or wind-
activated devices or fluorescent paints or dyes.

9 ~~**(2)** One temporary banner sign is allowed on each building frontage or building~~

neat, clean, and in good repair.

~~(4) The height to which a balloon may be displayed shall not exceed thirty five feet from point of attachment. Balloons shall be securely attached and adequately tethered by a nonmetallic cable so as to withstand a wind pressure of thirty pounds per square foot of exposed surface. The Director may require any additional information and impose any conditions where such information or conditions are required to ensure the safety of the public or adjacent property. Balloons shall be limited to one per business per premise. Display period shall be limited to fourteen days in any six month period, measured from the date of issuance of the sign permit and shall not exceed two permits in any one year.~~

Balloons are allowed subject to the following:

(A) The height to which a balloon may be displayed shall not exceed thirty-five feet from point of attachment.

(B) Shall be securely attached and adequately tethered by a nonmetallic cable so as to withstand a wind pressure of thirty pounds per square foot of exposed surface.

(C) The Director may require any additional information and impose any conditions where such information or conditions are required to ensure the safety of the public or adjacent property.

(D) Display period shall be limited to fourteen days in any six-month period, and shall not exceed two periods in any one year per business per premise.

900.165. Temporary Signs in Residential Zones. The following temporary signs are allowed in the Residential Agriculture (RA), Single Family Residential (RS), Duplex Residential (RD), Multiple Family Residential (RM1 and RM2), Multiple Family High-Rise Residential (RH), and Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) zones:

(a) Lawn signs, sidewalks signs, and portable signs conforming to the number and display surface limitations as provided in Table 900-12.

900.200. Permanent Signs in Central Business District (CB), Retail Commercial (CR), and General Commercial (CG) Zones. The following permanent signs are allowed in the Central Business District (CB), Retail Commercial (CR), and General Commercial (CG) zones.

(a) Dwellings. Single family dwellings and dwelling units in duplexes are allowed either one wall sign or one freestanding sign. A wall sign shall be limited to a display surface not exceeding one square foot. A freestanding sign shall be limited to a display surface not exceeding one square foot and to a height not exceeding thirty inches.

(b) Permanent Signs for Businesses. Unless the business is located in a shopping center or office complex, a business may have the following signs:

(1) One freestanding sign, one projecting sign, one roof sign, or one wall sign on each ~~building~~ street frontage. When the business is located on a corner lot, only one freestanding sign shall be allowed.

(A) Freestanding Signs.

(i) Height. The height of a freestanding sign shall not exceed twenty feet for up to the first one hundred feet of street front property line, plus an additional one foot in height for each twenty feet of street front property line over one hundred feet, with a maximum height not exceeding thirty feet.

(ii) Area. The display surface of a freestanding sign shall not exceed one square foot per lineal foot of street front property line up to the first one hundred square feet of display surface, plus an additional one-quarter square foot of display surface for each additional one foot of street front property line over one hundred feet, with a maximum display surface not exceeding one hundred fifty square feet.

(B) Wall Signs.

(i) For CR and CG zones, the display surface for a wall sign shall not exceed one

hundred twenty-five square feet. Notwithstanding the size of the display surface authorized by this subparagraph, wall signs that are located on a marquee shall not extend below the lower edge of the marquee and shall be limited to a height not exceeding thirty inches.

14 **(i) Height.** Freestanding sign height is limited to twenty feet for up to the first
15 one hundred feet of street front property line, plus an additional one foot in height
for each twenty feet of street front property line over one hundred feet, with a
maximum height of thirty feet.

16 **(ii) Area.** Where the sign is a freestanding sign, the sign shall be limited in area
17 to one square foot per lineal foot of street front property line up to the first one
18 hundred square feet of display surface, plus an additional one-quarter square foot
of display surface for each additional one foot of street front property line over

2 **(7) Vehicle Service or Loading Directional Sign.** In lieu of the sign allowed in SRC

14 Recorder shall not alter the sense, meaning, effect or substance of this ordinance, but within such
15 limitations, may:

16 (a) Renumber sections and parts of sections of the ordinance;

17 (b) Rearrange sections;

18 (c) Change reference numbers to agree with renumbered chapters, sections or other parts;

19 (d) Delete references to repealed sections;

20 (e) Substitute the proper subsection, section or chapter, or other division numbers;

21 (f) Change capitalization and spelling for the purpose of uniformity;

22 (g) Add headings for purposes of grouping like sections together for ease of reference; and

(h) Correct manifest clerical, grammatical or typographical errors.

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1 **Section 7. Severability.** Each section of this ordinance, and any part thereof, is severable, and
2 if any part of this ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of
3 this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
