

## City of Salem Water Quality Event – Water Distribution Statistics

As of 6/24/2018

The City of Salem, in partnership with Marion County, City of Keizer, City of Woodburn, East Salem Suburban Water District, and the Oregon Army National Guard, have operated a total of ten public water distribution sites during the first water quality advisory (5/29/2018 - 6/2/2018) and the second, on-going advisory that began on June 6, 2018. The following is a list of the current water distribution sites and their hours of operation:

### Statistics

- The City has provided water distribution sites for 21 days between 5/31/2018 and 6/24/2018, with most sites operated around the clock, staffed by City employees, County employees, Oregon Army National Guard soldiers, and community volunteers. Currently 6 sites are operating 12 hours per day and 3 sites 24 hours per day.
- During those days of operation, the City of Salem has used as many as 40 staff per day in water distribution activities, for an estimated total of 8,800 hours of paid time. (based on operational shift assignments – more detailed estimates will be available when payroll records are complete).
- The total amount of bulk water distributed is estimated to be in the range of 9,000 to 12,000 gallons per day to a range of 2,000 to 2,300 vehicles per day.
- Total amount of bulk water distributed to the public from 5/31/2018 to 6/24/2018 is estimated to be 200,000 gallons.
- The total amount of pre-packaged (bottled or gallon jug) water distributed at the water distribution sites is estimated to be 12,700 gallons.
- An estimated total of 6,000 gallons of water have been delivered by City, Marion County and Marion-Polk Food Share employees and volunteers to home-bound individuals during this event.
