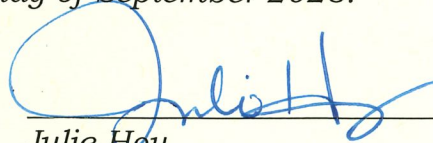
**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Julie Hoy, Mayor of the City of Salem, do hereby proclaim September 15-October 15, 2025, as
