WHEREAS, President Lyndon Johnson began the practice in 1968 with the Hispanic Heritage Week, and it was later extended to a 30-day observance period under President Ronald Regan; and

WHEREAS, Hispanics and Latinos represent a vibrant and thriving part of Salem's diverse community and make valuable contributions in business, industry, government, education, and the arts; and

WHEREAS, our city is greatly enriched by its Hispanic presence, and we look forward to continuing our strong relationship with our friends who contribute so much to Salem and surrounding communities;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Chris Hoy, Mayor of the City of Salem, do hereby proclaim September 2024, as
