

## Mitigation Plan for Temporary Parking Closures on Salem Health Campus

### Campus Parking Impact:

1. Proposed Street Parking Closures:
  - University Street SE – Mission to Shelton Ditch – 29 stalls impacted
  - Oak Street SE – University to 12<sup>th</sup> – 17 stalls impacted
  - Leslie Street SE – University to 12<sup>th</sup> – 11 stalls impacted
  - Total stalls impacted by temp parking closures - 57
  
2. Campus Parking Impacts from the A Expansion Project:
  - Permanent closure of ED parking lot for primary construction site – 111 stalls impacted
  - Temporary closure of portion of staff surface lot for construction staging - 156 stalls impacted
  - Total stalls impacted by A Expansion construction - 267
  
3. Proposed Duration of Impact:
  - January 1, 2020 – July 1, 2022 (30 months)

### Proposed Mitigation Plan:

1. Reallocate on-campus parking
  - Patients and visitors will be accommodated in other on-site parking options
  - Valet service will be in place for specific patient populations
  
2. Lease Offsite Lot & Operate Shuttle
  - Salem Hospital has leased the K-MART lot at 25<sup>th</sup> and Mission Street SE for the duration of construction, this lot provides roughly 500 existing parking stalls.
  - In partnership with Towne Park, Salem Hospital will operate an employee shuttle service between the leased lot and their main hospital campus every few minutes during peak arrival and departure times and then frequently throughout the course of the day for the entire duration of the construction.
  - The shuttle will run Monday through Friday, dayshift only.
  - Salem Hospital staff will be encouraged to exit to the right out the lot onto either 25<sup>th</sup> or Mission street to promote safety.
  - The offsite lot and shuttle program will also be used to offset parking impacts anticipated during the upcoming seismic retrofit of the existing parking structure.
  
3. Transportation Demand Management (TDM)
  - Simultaneous to the shuttling effort, Salem Hospital is increasing its organizational focus on supporting and incentivizing alternate means of transportation with the goal of reducing single occupancy trips to campus by staff.
  - This includes expanded carpooling, biking, bus and micro transit (scooters and motorcycles) programs.
  - The on campus TDM efforts will continue beyond the completion of the A Expansion project.
