## **END NOTES TO CHANGE ORDERS:**

- 1. Change Order No. 3 adds \$902,500:** Provides for a three year period and is the full amount of the minimum revenue guarantee agreement with Dept of Transportation and the local match with Travel Salem. These expenses are fully reimbursed during the period of this agreement.
- 2. Change Order No. 1 adds \$451,587:** Provides for the necessary services to continue the project through executing Construction Documents getting the City ready for construction next summer.
- 3. Change Order No. 1 adds \$27,743.05:** Provides for City directed changes due to limited as-built information available during design, which caused unknowns during construction resulting in more construction work required to complete the project.
- 4. Change Order No. 1 adds \$49,969.70:** Provides for the development of the Stream Function Assessment Method, additional negotiations with resource agencies, and updates to the project plans reflecting the current design modifications.
- 5. Change Order No. 1 adds \$33,128.86:** Underestimated usage for this fiscal year.
- 6. Change Order No. 1 adds \$257,361.66:** Provides for the tasks and deliverables through the development of the construction documents and establishment of the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP).
- 7. Change Order No. 6 adds \$80,000:** Provides for the completion of all work necessary to operate the South Primary Effluent pump station during the NPDES permitted wet weather season directing flow to the aeration basin which includes the installation of all valves, and installation of one 24-inch valve including its testing and commissioning.
- 8. Change Order No. 1 adds \$50,000:** Underestimated usage for this fiscal year.
- 9. Change Order No. 1 adds \$115,000:** Underestimated usage for this fiscal year.
- 10. Change Order No. 2 adds \$39,073:** Provides for additional assistance needed with commissioning, final walkthrough, and review.
- 11. Change Order No. 2 adds \$100,000:** Provides for City directed additional effort needed for a contract extension and amendment for the PFAS Response Plan work.

## Category II: Annual Requirement Contracts

The following Category II Annual Requirement Contracts were approved administratively during the month of September 2024. The not-to-exceed contract amounts are competitively set by applying bidder's/proposer's per unit price(s) to estimated annual requirement quantities. These contracts carry no guarantee for quantity of units purchased or services performed during any annual contract period. Both the bids and the contracts themselves state that the City retains the right to not award contracts and/or change contract amounts, both dollar and quantity, based on specific Council/Budget Committee actions/decisions. These are non-exclusive, one-year contracts that may be renewed for up to four additional one-year renewal periods.
