What do you feel you can contribute as a board or commission member?

As a US Forest Service employee with over 25 years of experience—and a parent and frequent user of the City's parks and recreation areas—I'm eager to contribute to the care, maintenance, and development of our public outdoor spaces. My experience with the Forest Service has given me an appreciation for public lands and the value of community input in their management. I'm looking for meaningful ways to stay connected to our city and believe serving on, or becoming more involved with, the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board would be a valuable way to apply my skills and experience. While my long-term goal is to become a board member, I am currently interested in any opportunities to attend board meetings as a prospective board member and gaining insight and experience into board matters.

What prompted your interest in applying to serve as a board or commission member?

I've lived in Salem since 2018 and am seeking ways to feel more connected to the community by giving my time to things that I value. As a parent of a young child and someone who prioritizes time spent in nature, I am a frequent user of our parks and recreation facilities and am interested in how we maintain and enhance the outdoor spaces in Salem. I am especially drawn to the City's efforts to balance developed recreation and preservation and restoration of native oak habitats.

Please explain how your education, professional, personal, lived, or volunteer experience and knowledge qualify you to serve on the board(s) or commission(s) for which you are applying.

Through my work with the US Forest Service, I've come to appreciate the complexities of public land management. While my primary focus has been fire management, I've also contributed to interdisciplinary teams conducting environmental analysis for forest project, work that requires balancing ecological goals with public expectations. Stakeholders often hold diverse, sometimes conflicting, views on how public lands should be managed. I've learned to embrace these tensions and recognize that while no decision will satisfy everyone, inclusive and thoughtful engagement honors the principle that public lands are managed by and for the people. My academic background in natural resources provides a strong foundation in land management, while my studies in history offer valuable perspective on the cultural significance of our landscapes. Parks and natural areas are not only ecological assets but also reflections of our shared heritage. I'm committed to preserving cultural sites and native habitats, while also supporting practical decisions that ensure access and enhance quality of life for all Salem residents.
