## Mayor's Resiliency Task Force Presented to City Council— October 28, 2019

- Resiliency Task Force meeting dates:
  - 1. Wednesday October 30, 6:00 8:00 p.m.
  - 2. Wednesday November 6, 6:00 8:00 p.m.
  - 3. Wednesday November 13, 6:00 8:00 p.m.
  - 4. If additional meetings are needed dates/times will be established on November 13.
  - 5. Once the meetings are complete, the actual training process will begin.
- The meetings identified will give the task force an opportunity to confirm and refine the current goals and propose any additional goals.
  - 1. Evaluate if reaching 50,000 community members over two years is a realistic goal and expectation that can be accomplished.
  - 2. Identify what training is acceptable to count towards the goal.
  - 3. Identify and review survey questions that will quantify current and future status of preparedness and methodology for delivering the surveys.
  - 4. Identify what qualifications are needed for instructors.
  - 5. Identify how to schedule, plan and deliver the training.
  - 6. Identify how to market and gain community interest in the training.
