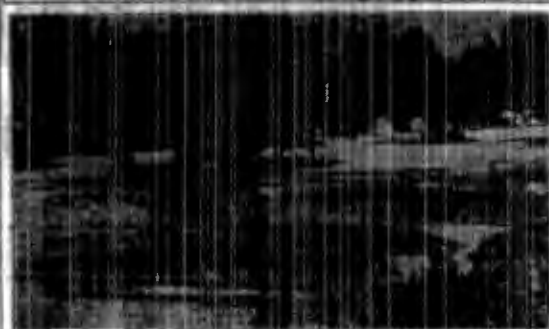

They agreed that the municipal camp park is going out of date as a general principle, but pointed out that the city's camp ground is the only one centrally located, and for this reason should be retained.

It was stated that a centrally located camp ground is the only one that will bring visitors into the business district to do their trading, and the only one that will prevent them from coming here to make their homes.

The local camp ground, which a few years ago had a poor reputation with travelers because of the lack of cabins, is now reported as one of the best along the Pacific highway in Oregon. The municipal inspector recently gave it a perfect rating.

Closeness to the downtown district is found to be a great attraction, and with cabins from Clark street now provided, the city "tourists from Portland" making a hit with travelers.
