Has the Salem City Council considered compromise with regard to the proposed end of free-on-street-parking-downtown?

Wouldn't reducing the free parking time to two hours while sustaining the current parking tax bring in more money? The idea might not be perfect, but it's no more flawed than the proposal to remove the free-three-hour- on-street-parking option. Salem residents and visitors have already experienced less retail choice after the exit of JC Penney and Nordstrom and dealt with more sidewalk obstruction from tents and trash. True, the parkades offer parking but they also include safety and convenience issues.

If a primary goal is to create and keep a vital and welcoming downtown, there must be a better plan than one that proposes to end a surviving reason to frequent the area.
