2	AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO POSSESSION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN	
3	PARKS; AMENDING SALEM REVISED CODE (SRC) 94.195; AND DECLARING AN	
4	EMERGENCY.	
5	The City of Salem ordains as follows:	
6	Section 1. SRC 94.195 is amended as follows:	
7	Sec. 94.195 Possession of alcoholic beverages in parks.	
8	(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an alcoholic beverage in any park,	
9	sports field, city-owned facility, or any event on property controlled by the City and	
10	requiring a permit from the Director, except as provided in subsection (b) and subsection	
11	(c) of this section.	
12	(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a person 21 years of age or older may	
13	possess an alcoholic beverage that is less than 14 percent of alcohol by volume in the	
14	following places and under the following circumstances:	
15	(1) At Wallace Marine Softball Complex if the alcoholic beverage is purchased from	
16	a concessionaire that is operating pursuant to a permit issued by the <u>Director</u>	
17	Department of Community Services and licensed by the Oregon Liquor Control	
18	Commission; provided, however, that the person shall not remove the alcoholic	
19	beverage, or cause or permit the alcoholic beverage to be removed by any other	
20	person, from the Wallace Marine Softball Complex.	
21	(2) At events authorized by the Director and conducted on City-owned premises, if	
22	the alcoholic beverage is purchased from a concessionaire that is operating pursuant	
23	to a permit issued by the City and licensed by the Oregon Liquor Control	
24	Commission; provided, however, that the person may not possess the alcoholic	
25	beverage on such premises, or cause or permit the alcoholic beverage to be possessed	
26	by any other person on such premises, more than one hour following closure of the	
27	event.	
28	(3) As part of an event for which the Director has issued a permit for the consumption	
29	of alcohol pursuant to regulations adopted by the Director. The alcoholic beverage	
30	must remain within the area reserved for consumption by the permit.	
	(4) At events at City-owned facilities, including, but not limited to, Deepwood Estate,	

1	Bush Art Barn, Bush House, the Riverfront Carousel, and A.C. Gilbert's Discovery	
2	Village, if such possession has been authorized by the Director or the City's	
3	authorized operational contractor of the facility.	
4	(c) Notwithstanding subsection (a) and (b) of this section, a person 21 years of age or	
5	older may possess an alcoholic beverage that is equal to or greater than 14 percent of	
6	alcohol by volume at Riverfront Park or Bush's Pasture Park if the alcoholic beverage is	
7	purchased from a concessionaire that is operating pursuant to a permit issued by the	
8	<u>Director and licensed by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission</u> . The alcoholic beverage	
9	must remain within the area reserved for consumption by the permit.	
10	(d)-(e) As used in this section, the terms "possession" and "to possess" mean the physical	
11	possession of, or the exercise of dominion and control over, the alcoholic beverage;	
12	provided, however, that a person shall not be deemed to possess an alcoholic beverage if	
13	the beverage is in any bottle, can, or other receptacle that is unopened or where the seal	
14	has not been broken, and which is contained within a vehicle owned or controlled by the	
15	person.	
16	Section 2. Codification. In preparing this ordinance for publication and distribution, the Cit	
17	Recorder shall not alter the sense, meaning, effect, or substance of this ordinance, but within	
18	such limitations, may:	
19	(a) Renumber sections and parts of sections of the ordinance;	
20	(b) Rearrange sections;	
21	(c) Change reference numbers to agree with renumbered chapters, sections, or other	
22	parts;	
23	(d) Delete references to repealed sections;	
24	(e) Substitute the proper subsection, section, chapter, or other division numbers;	
25	(f) Change capitalization and spelling for the purpose of uniformity;	
26	(g) Add headings for purposes of grouping like sections together for ease of reference;	
27	and	
28	(h) Correct manifest clerical, grammatical, or typographical errors.	
29	Section 3. Severability. Each section of this ordinance, and any part thereof, is severable,	
30	and if any part of this ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the	

1	remainder of this ordinance shall remain in full force and	remainder of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.		
2	Section 4. Emergency Clause. This act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the			
3	public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in			
4	full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.	full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.
