They include cases under investigation and cases still pending adjudication.</li> <li>Once all information is obtained, it is evaluated by a trained department employee to determine whether the issuance of a license could potentially place the public at risk. This is based on all information available.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Investigation starts with an "identity verification" using applicant's name and social security number to make sure they match through credit reporting agencies.</li> <li>Then a records search is conducted online through public database sources.</li> <li>Local police records are not available and not considered.</li> <li>They do not check for local police contacts and have no access to open investigations or cases pending adjudication.</li> <li>If local court records will be checked, Checkr primarily uses unnamed contract personnel through "sourcing companies." They have no background or control over these researchers.</li> <li>Checkr "[does not] rely on NCIC or FBI records because they are unreliable." They have the same opinion of fingerprints as being "unreliable" in background investigations.</li> </ul>
