Thank you for reaching out with feedback and questions about the proposed plastic bag ordinance in Salem. Your message initially went to the City Recorder's junk mail, so I just received it today. Below are the answers to your questions:

- 1. The phrase "of stores" should not have been included. Thank you for finding this error. This phrase will be removed before the continuation of the Public Hearing on October 22nd.
- 2. In the current proposal, retail establishments or food providers that are greater than 10,000 square feet in size would need to comply by April 1, 2019. All retail establishments or food providers 10,000 square feet or smaller would need to comply by September 1, 2019.
- 3. It seems that the bead bags you are describing would fall under the definition of product or produce bag any bag without handles provided to a customer for use within a retail establishment to assist in the collection or transport of products to the point of sale. Product or produce bags would not be affected by this ordinance.

I also saw the question that was sent separately about the pass-through charge. The \$0.05 charge per recyclable paper bag would be retained by retailers. Please let me know if you have any further questions.

Within about a month the whole place was a LOT cleaner. And paper bags worked just as well for anything we needed.

Message	I oppose the bag ban as proposed, but support a more effective form of regulation. If the goal is to protect the environment, it will not be met through a ban on plastic and encouragement of paper. Paper bags have a much higher embedded energy in their life cycle, require significant water in their production, and in most cases are not reusable. Instead, I support a pass-through fee of 3-5 cents for every single-use cash register bag (whether paper or plastic). This fee would fund provision of reusable bags made of recycled plastic for those who cannot afford them. Remaining funds would be used for a range of efforts, from litter pickups and stream cleanups to park improvements and more tree planting along streets.
