The East Lancaster Neighborhood Association has not had a chance to discuss the proposal for creating a City Operations Fee to fund City services (Ordinance Bill 12-19).

While there have been some brief comments made at recent meetings our Board has not had a presentation or discussion about why this fee is needed, nor how funds will be utilized.

The Board voted unanimously at our October 3, 2019 meeting to request that prior to moving this issue forward an effort be made to have staff attend all 18 neighborhood associations to give a presentation and answer questions. Without a good understanding it is our concern that we cannot participate in the process you are undertaking and many may not support this action.

ELNA board understands there is a budget shortfall facing the City of Salem. We want to be a part of the effort to address this problem and including us in a dialog seems prudent before decisions are made by Council.
