

Proposed Amendment #1: 2019 - 2020 Annual Action Plan (AAP)

The Salem Keizer Consortium receive an annual entitlement allocation from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for HOME Investment Partnership Program funds (HOME) to assist low-to-moderate-income households. HUD requires a five-year Consolidated Plan to set goals and prioritize needs that can be addressed with federal funds. The goals are ending homelessness, expanding affordable housing, and economic development.

The Consortium must submit an Annual Action Plan (AAP) to be eligible to receive HOME funds. The AAP identifies all resources and proposed expenditures. Any amendments to funding are required to follow the same public review process as the original AAP approval.

The 2019-2020 proposed project address the priorities identified in the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan, the City's Strategic Plan and the Mid-Willamette Homeless Initiative work plan.

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Amendment #1 to the 2019 Annual Action Plan:

Goal 1: End Homelessness

Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA), homeless case management, interim housing assistance (subsistence payments), and case management for victims of domestic violence and human trafficking.

- Award \$193,000 in funding for Mid-Willamette Valley Community Action Agency ARCHES program for rent and security deposits associated with the AHOP Tenant Based Rental Assistance for 12 households. This amount is unallocated resources remaining in the 2019 HUD HOME formula award.
