Substantial Amendment #2: 2018 Annual Action Plan Amendment









Introduction

This document contains information related to the proposed amendment to the 2018 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program Annual Action Plan (AAP). This is the second amendment to the 2018 AAP. The previous amendment has been approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD.

Purpose

The purpose of this amendment is to describe the City's proposed change in funding use for the program year 2018 CDBG resources. The proposed amendment is necessary due to the unallocated availability of Program Income (PI).

The Federal Programs Division utilizes the above objectives and outcomes to determine the eligibility of programs and projects proposed as a part of this amendment process.

2018 Annual Action Plan Available Funds: \$161,530 (Program Income)

Amendment #2 to the 2018 Annual Action Plan

- Increase funding for *Garten Services*, *Inc.* by \$60,000 for completion of recycling center modernization. This increase is due to construction cost exceeding the anticipated amount when the application was considered.
- Increase funding for *Integrated Services for Living* by **\$101,530** for completion of rehabilitation of affordable housing for persons living with disabilities. This increase is due to construction cost exceeding the anticipated amount when the application was considered.

Should the proposed projects result in unspent, uncommitted funds additional Amendments will be presented to the public and Salem City Council for review and reconsideration.
