Far too many of our friends and neighbors cannot afford a home, or even a safe place to shelter for the night. They are forced to sleep in their cars, or in tents and makeshift shelters wherever they can.

Nightingale Hosted Shelters (NHS) is part of Eugene's Rest Stop Program and was created to respond to this problem. At NHS people find a welcoming community that is self-governed by the residents and administered by two on-site camp managers. There is also a Board of Directors that coordinate fundraiser events, and provide guidance and rest stop support.

NHS is more than a shelter. It is designed to help people transition to more permanent housing. The managers and Board work to connect residents with support and resources to help them move toward a more sustainable housing situation.



NHS residents sign agreements to abide by rest stop rules. NHS provides portable restrooms and trash collection. Residents take pride in Nightingale and keep the site tidy. They are encouraged to be good neighbors both to each other and to the people and businesses in the surrounding area.

NHS and other rest stops in the city are paid for and managed by a non-profit organization. The City of Eugene, Lane County and The Eugene Mission provide the land. All rest stops are fenced to control access and promote safety.



There are currently 16 Conestoga huts at our Hilyard site. Over 146 former residents have found housing since NHS began operations.



Ways to support NHS Rest Stop:

Any donation of food is appreciated. Clothing and sleeping bag donations will be shared with the unhoused community.



Who pays for the rest stops?

Nonprofit organizations pay for the cost of setting up and running the rest stops. The City of Eugene, Lane County, and the Mission provide the land.
