

## RESOLUTION NO. 2020-37

A RESOLUTION EXTENDING A STATE OF EMERGENCY RELATING TO UNSHELTERED RESIDENTS IN THE CITY OF SALEM, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2020-4

**Whereas**, on January 21, 2020 City Council adopted Resolution No. 2020-4, declaring a state of emergency relating to unsheltered residents in the city of Salem (the “Declaration”), and extended the Declaration through August 15, 2020 through Resolution No. 2020-14;

**Whereas**, the Declaration authorized the City Manager to issue an emergency order creating a vehicle camping pilot program for unsheltered individuals, and suspend City laws to allow United Way’s Safe Sleep shelter to expand to 19 people while United Way obtained land use approval;

**Whereas**, United Way obtained approval for an emergency shelter for Safe Sleep through state legislation rendering the City Manager’s Emergency Order moot;

**Whereas**, the City Council desires to extend the state of emergency to allow the vehicle camping program to continue.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SALEM, OREGON,  
RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Resolution No. 2020-4 is hereby amended to read:

**Section 5(e)** is deleted in its entirety.

**Section 6** is amended to read: “**Section 6.** *This declaration shall terminate, unless expressly extended by the Salem City Council, on ~~AUGUST 25, 2020~~ January 12, 2021.*”

**Section 2.** The City Manager shall issue an order extending the previous order authorizing a pilot program for vehicle camping.

**Section 3.** Except as amended herein, Resolution No. 2020-4, as previously amended by Resolution No. 2020-14 shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

**Section 4.** This resolution is effective upon adoption.
