I'm a little concerned about this unfortunate situation at Cascades Gateway Park reported today in the paper and broadcast on the news.

In the recent past I sent an email to everyone listed above and asked if we had a plan for high water in the homeless parks near Salem. I received a message back stating that the email was forwarded to the person who has the responsibility to coordinate the homeless issues within Salem.

I received an email back from this person who indicated that their was a plan. I was told many organizations were involved on helping out in a situation like this if it would come to the point and be needed.

My concerns then were who would evacuate those homeless living near the waters edge, where they would go upon being moved, who picks up the personal property of the homeless that they seem to acquire in large amounts, who would pick up the garbage prior to high water so it does not float downriver to Keizer and the communities down river and eventually to Ocean.

I had some relief to know that this action that I asked about was under control and dropped the issue after receiving this email.

The pictures in the article show exactly what I was talking about. So my questions are "What Happened to the plan"? Now who is going to clean up the mess? When will it be cleaned up? Where were the homeless moved to? How much garbage was hauled away prior to the high water arriving? (I suppose after the high waters recede and for safety sakes when it drys out)

I can assume since this high water came over the weekend City crews and volunteers might not be available to help and assist on Sat and Sun. Did the plan account for needed support over a weekend?

I will wrap up by saying that this high water event was no surprise to anyone, reports were out days earlier telling everyone to look out for high water in low areas. On the radio report a homeless women said the homeless were not notified, I have no idea of the person they quoted was around when they notified or not, maybe she was correct that they were not notified and she did say she lost everything.

Maybe the "plan" was initiated, maybe everything was done that could have been done? Maybe the homeless did not move out when directed or asked to? So I think I have the right to have my earlier

concerns answered, what went wrong with the 'Plan" if anything, where did the homeless go, how much trash was picked up, etc...

This issue impacts all of Salem downstream, Polk County and Oregon. I wonder how much garbage will end up in Salem from homeless camps upstream and deposited on our banks, I just hope that the drug needles do not get buried in the sand for someone to step on this summer.
