DISCUSSION:

On December 8, 2021, the Salem Human Rights Commission adopted the recommendation of its *Equity Lens Chapter 97 Workgroup sub-committee* (Attachment 1). It recommends that City Council consider amendments to SRC chapter 97 - Human Rights - to:

- 1. Explore the adoption of "housing status" as a protected class under the chapter, and
- 2. Review SRC 97.085 to potentially remove usage of gendered language to be more inclusive.
